35 Districts identified by MHA as worst affected

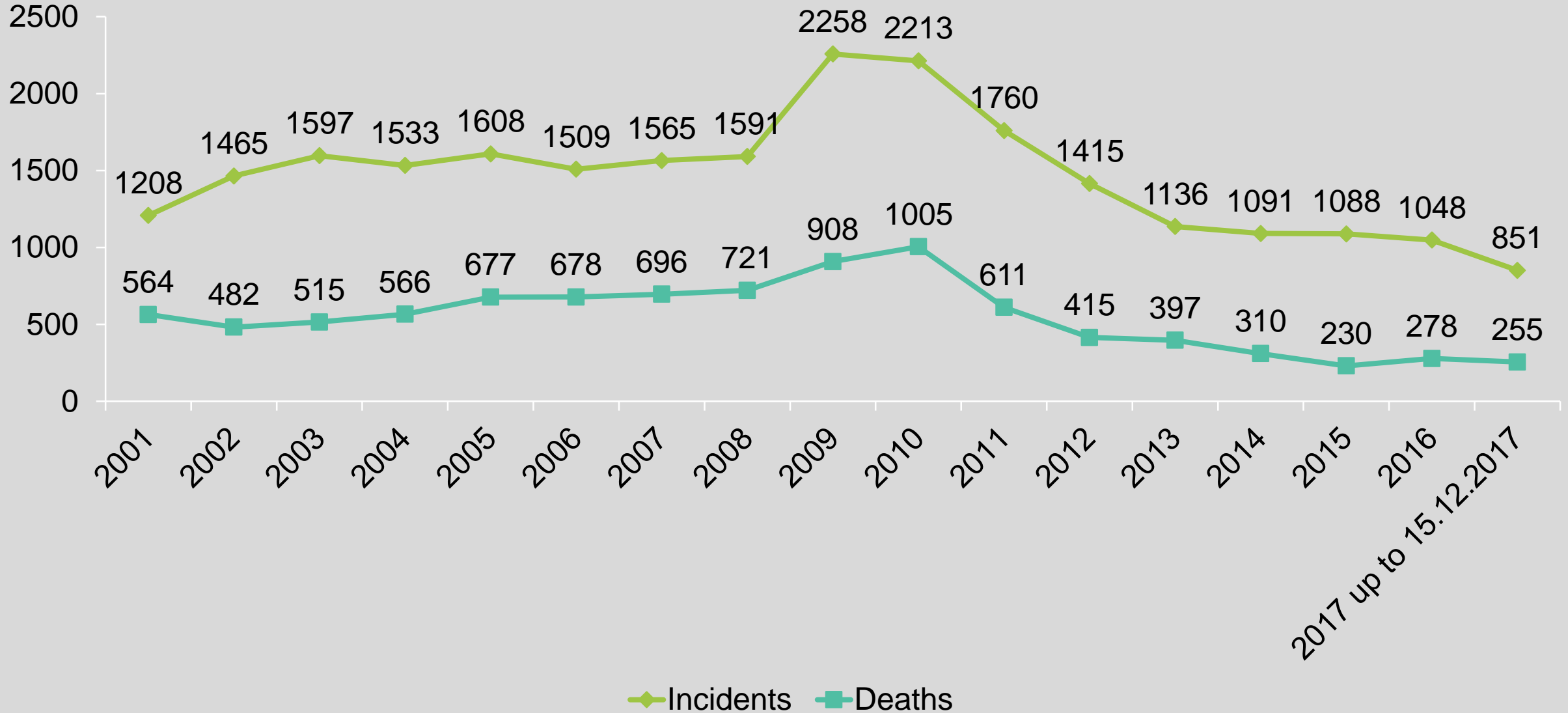

Maoist ideology based on theme of displacement of tribals, exploitation and human rights violations

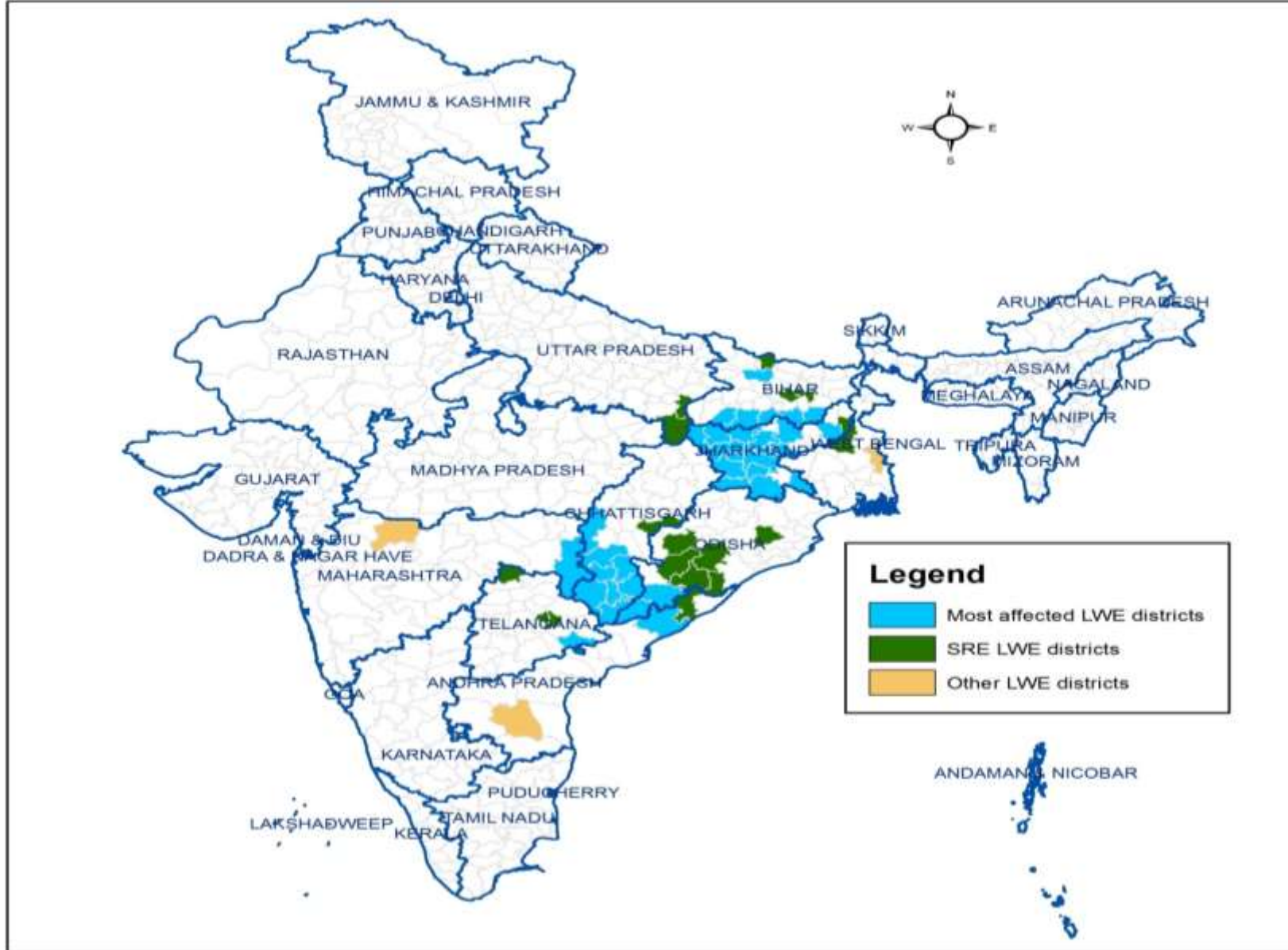
Multi pronged approach under National Action Plan comprising security measures, development measures, ensuring rights and entitlements of locals and perception management

Steady decline in LWE violence and geographical spread

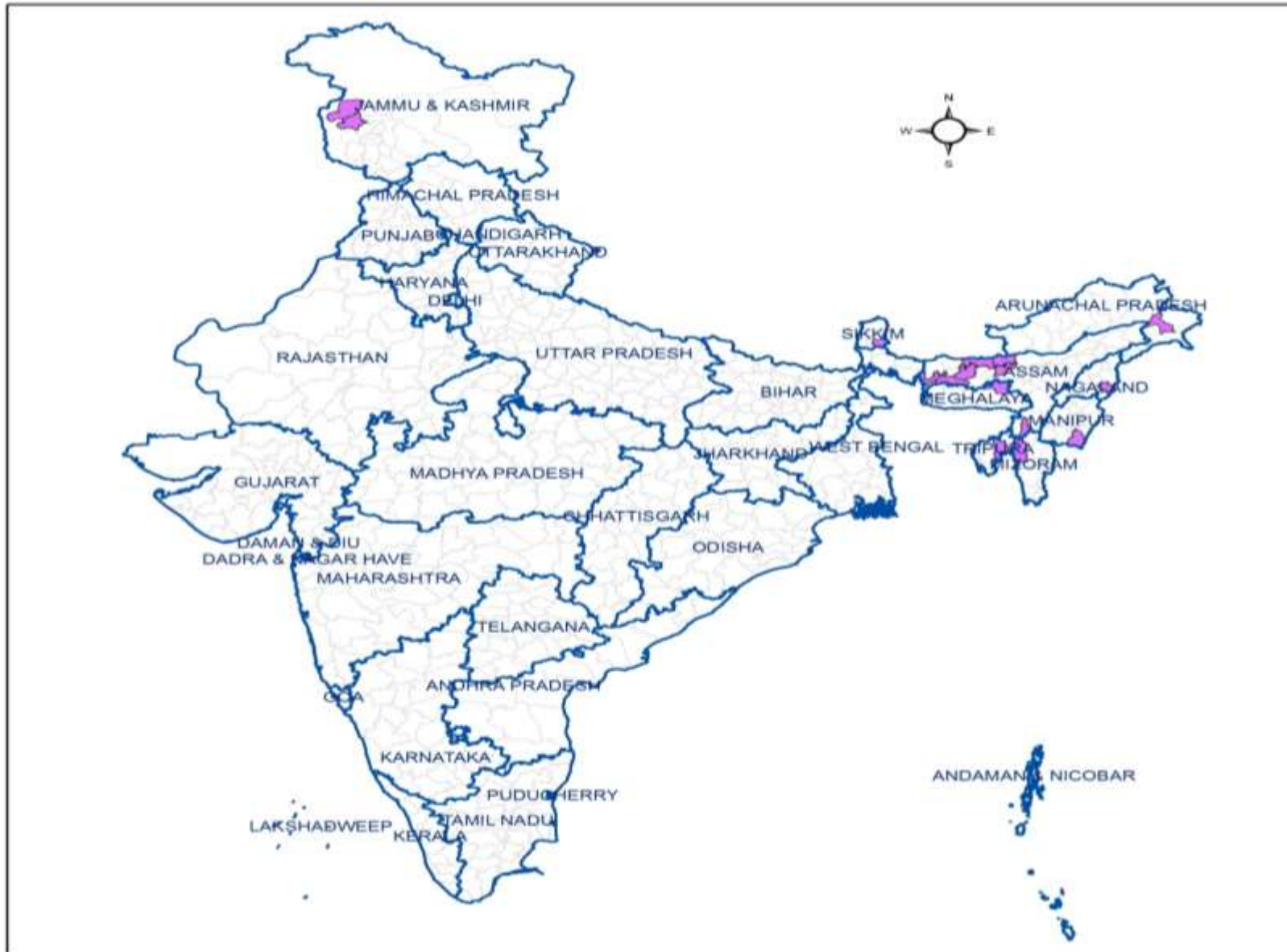

Scheme aimed at transforming the 35 worst LWE affected districts


For filling the critical gaps in Public infrastructure and Services, which are of emergent nature, and are not covered under any other developmental scheme

Approximately Rs. 30 crore per district per year for three years

Funds sanctioned by District Committee

CHALLENGES REMAIN



Significant decline in LWE violence, shrinking geographical spread, however challenges remain

Strong correlation between between incidence of extremism and poor socio-economic indicators

MHA has well established mechanisms for monitoring & decision making

Need for major developmental push to root out left wing extremism

District Magistrates	Prabhari Officers
Suggest specific, actionable interventions in existing schemes	Monitor, guide & facilitate
Promote involvement of civil society and youth	Act as a bridge between Centre and States
Unleash competitive spirit among all stakeholders	Ensure convergence between Central & State Schemes
Sharing information on district specific issues (eg. Arsenic contamination)	Suggest policy changes and additional measures
Dissemination of best practices ('Dular' in Giridh, Jharkhand)	Remove bottlenecks and suggest special dispensation/relaxation required
