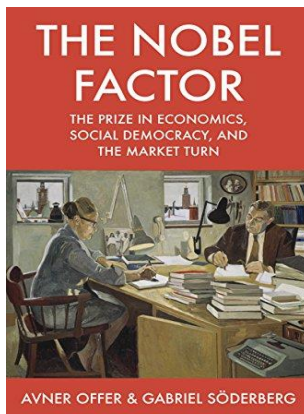

1. The Nobel Factor: The Prize in Economics, Social Democracy, and the Market Turn /Avner Offer



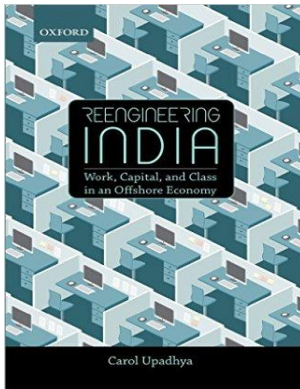

2. Reengineering India: Work, Capital, and Class in an Offshore Economy/ Carol Upadhyia



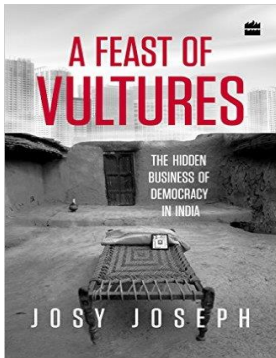

3. A Feast of Vultures: The Hidden Business of Democracy in India/ Josy Joseph



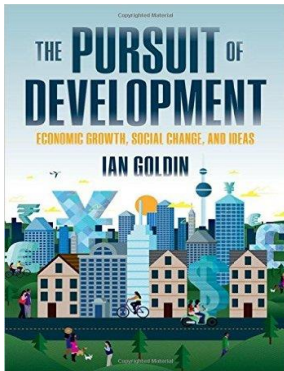

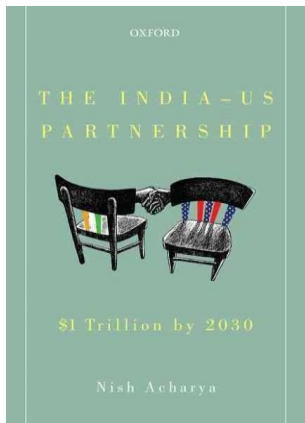

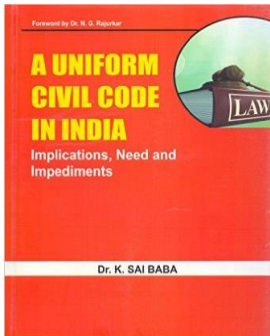

6. A Uniform Civil Code in India: Implications, Need and Impediments/ **K.Sai Baba**



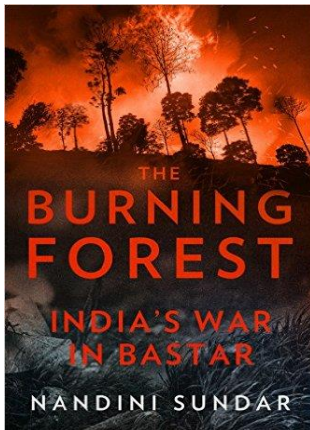

7. The Burning Forest: India's War in Bastar /Nandini Sundar



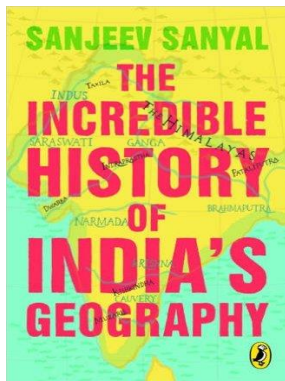

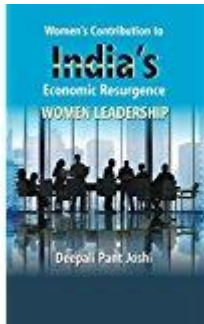

9. Women's Contribution to India's Economic Resurgence : Women Leadership/ Deepali Pant Joshi



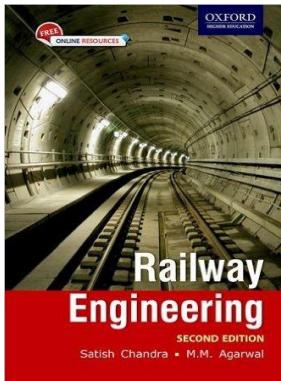
