



### 1. Behind the Curve by Robert Z. Lawrence



Manufacturing jobs, once the backbone of the modern US economy, have declined as a share of GDP over recent decades, darkening opportunities for middle-class advancement. Similar trends have impacted export superpowers like China, Germany, Japan, Singapore, and South Korea. Driven by nostalgia for a bygone era, however, many countries have turned to reshoring and "industrial policies" to revive manufacturing employment. In this book, Robert Z. Lawrence argues that these efforts are unlikely to succeed. He demonstrates that deeply rooted forces common to all countries technological change, shifting consumer spending patterns, and trade—account for lagging manufacturing employment and that these trends are unlikely to be reversed. The industrial sector's historic role as an engine of opportunity and inclusive growth is unsustainable. Government efforts to promote manufacturing to achieve goals such as industrial self-sufficiency, green transitions, and digital technologies, however well intentioned, may even make economic growth less inclusive.

Instead, new policies are needed to help people, places, and countries cope with inevitable changes



### 2. Kaoboys of R&AW: Down Memory Lane by B. Raman



The book traverses through India's contemporary history most importantly the 1971 war; insurgency in the Northeast, Punjab, and Kashmir; the Emergency; the war in Afghanistan; and the intelligence imperatives and dispensation under Indira Gandhi, Morarji Desai, Rajiv Gandhi, V.P. Singh, Chandra Shekhar, and Narasimha Rao. Written with the purpose that a knowledge of the role played by R&AW in those events would possibly enable a better understanding of its strengths and weaknesses, it painstakingly avoids over-statements, exaggerations and spins.



They assess overall how all these issues have evolved in response to the dynamic needs of the city-state.

In the city-state, environmental concerns in general, and water concerns in particular, have played a major role in its transformation from a third world to a first-world country. How and why this transformation took place is the main focus of this authoritative book.

### 4. Spying in South Asia by Paul M. Mcgarr



In this first comprehensive history of India's secret Cold War, Paul McGarr tells the story of Indian politicians, human rights activists, and journalists as they fought against or collaborated with members of the British and US intelligence services. The interventions of these agents have had a significant and enduring impact on the political and social fabric of South Asia. The specter of a 'foreign hand,' or external intelligence activity, real and imagined, has occupied a prominent place in India's political discourse, journalism, and cultural production. Spying in South Asia probes the nexus between intelligence and statecraft in South Asia and the relationships between agencies and governments forged to promote democracy. McGarr asks why, in contrast to Western assumptions about surveillance, South Asians associate intelligence with covert action, grand conspiracy, and justifications for repression. In doing so, he uncovers a fifty-year battle for hearts and minds in the Indian subcontinent.

# 5. Reengineering the Corporation: A Manifesto for Business Revolution by Michael Hammer and James Champy



#### 6. REBOUND: Redemption from Cancer-Journey of Life by Subhash Sethi


