



This volume traces India's developmental strategies and governance systems from state-led to market-driven models over seven decades, highlighting the disconnect between the values enshrined in the Constitution and the governance of policies. 2. Teacher Education Landscapes in India by Pranati Panda







4. Everything all at Once: India and the Six Simultaneous Global Transitions by Rajiv Kumar





5. <u>Institutions and Public Policy for India's Sustainable Development Perspectives</u> on Governance, Technology, and Finance by Sukhpal Singh









8. How India Manages Its National Security by Arvind Gupta






